This delightful walk may be started in the Village or at the top of Reennanalagane Road just .5k from the Village centre. From the village head towards Killorglin (N70) and just after the Glenbeigh Hotel turn left onto the Reennanalagane Road. Follow the road for 2K until you reach Reennanalagane Beach. Relax and admire the views over Dooks Bay and Dingle Bay before making your way back again. Take care as you walk as this is on a public road. Usual caution should be taken especially with young children or walking with pets.









At the start of the Fairy Forest go straight on , rather than veering left to enter the Fairy Forest. Cross over the stile which leads to a pathway which is parallel to the public road to Rossbeigh. As the pathway rises admire the wonderful views over Rossbeigh beach and onwards to Dingle Bay and the Blasket Islands. If you decide to do the round trip, on the way back admire the views over Dooks, Cromane and onwards towards Castlemaine harbour. Note that good walking boots are required as the pathway is a little rough and can be a little muddy if it has rained.



The Fairy Forest walk has recently been developed by Glenbeigh Tidy Towns. The walk begins at the picnic area on the road to Rossbeigh Beach. Follow the R564 road from Glenbeigh Village to Rossbeigh beach and begin the walk at the picnic area about .5K from Glenbeigh Village. Look out for the signpost indicating the start of the Fairy Forest. This is a gentle walk ideal for families and is part of the Kerry Way. Enjoy the fairy houses and colourful stones located on the trees and pathway. For the Forest Walk Loop continue on to the end of the forest walk, turn left at the end of the forest on to the old railway walk back to the Behy Bridge. Continue on the public road R564 back to the start.



This walk begins at Rossbeigh at the end of Walk 4. Turn left and continue the road up the side of the mountain for 2k until you reach a crossroads. At the crossroads turn left and continue the road for 4k until you reach the R564 road at the bridge over the Behy River. Continue on the R564 until you reach the picnic area where Walk 4 begins. Take care as you walk as this is on a public road. Usual caution should be taken especially with young children or walking with pets.



This is a medium level walk and forms part of the Kerry Way. From Glenbeigh village follow the L7517 road up past the St. James Church for 1K. Look out for the Kerry Way signpost and turn left to follow the road until you reach a stile and gate. Cross over and begin the ascent up the pathway towards the Windy Gap. Continue the route on the other side of the mountain and enjoy the stunning views of the McGillycuddy reeks and Caragh Lake. Continue walking for 4K until you reach a 4 way junction. As you descend towards Glenbeigh look out for the Kerry Way sign. Turn left and follow the mountain pathway until you reach Kerry Ocean Lodge and continue left on the N70 until you reach Glenbeigh Village.



Rossbeigh Beach Walk walk 7, round trip distance 2km

This walk is on the foothpath at the entrance to Rossbeigh Beach. It is a flat walk and ideal for families with pushchairs, or wheelchair bound.

Irish Heart Foundation Approved Walk

This walk begins in the centre of Glenbeigh Village between the Village House

and Liosderrig House B&B's. Follow the road for 2k until you reach Kilnabrack

beach. Relax and admire the views over Rossbeigh Beach, Dingle Bay and

Dooks bay before making your way back to Glenbeigh Village. Take time to read

the nature signs on the route giving information on the local flora and fauna.

Take care as you walk as this is on a public road. Usual caution should be taken

especially with young children or walking with pets.
